Threatening weather failed to dampen the spirits of the picnickers as they spread out their lunch, enjoyed the prancing horses and gathered in groups to chat.

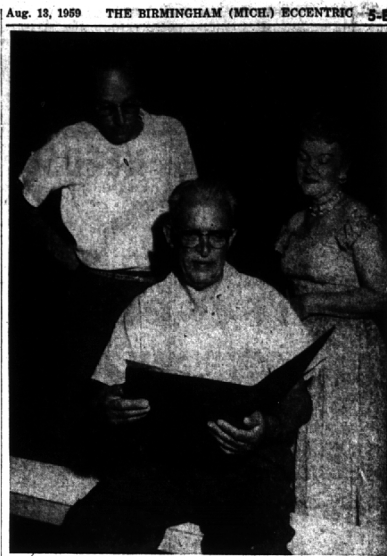
