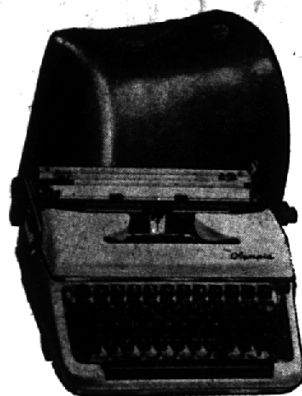

While moving day may be a crisis for many youngsters because it breaks up friendships and disrupts their lives—it isn't so for many others, sociologist Raymond Payne has learned upon querying nine hundred Georgia junior-high and high-school students.

Nine-tenths of this number had moved at least once, close to 40 per cent said moving was more desirable than always living in the same place. They felt that moving offered new adventures, contacts, and friendships.

**GIRLS FAYORED** moving more often than boys, perhaps because girls usually are more socially mature and more confident of their ability to make new friends and adjust wherever they go.

Dr. Payne believes that, if parents point out before hand the advantages of moving, the event will not be a crisis for a child, but will be anticipated with pleasure.
