clusters of four classrooms, each facing a court. Connecting the classroom group with two wings housing science is the library with its umbrella roof.

ALSO CENTERED between the two main corridors and pivoting the architectural group is the ad-ministration wing and main en-trance lobby. Surrounded by courts creating open privacy, this is the nerve center of administration and guidance.

The terminal ends of the two
main parallel corridors embrace
the music group and theater, then
empty into the large student or
public parking area.

FLANKING the music group off the south corridor is the home-making and arts group. Off the north corridor is the cafeteria, kitchen, receiving and mechanical services. This area includes the industrial arts and journalism fa-cilities

SUSPENDED between industrial arts on one side, academics on the other on two linking passages, are the indoor physical education facilities.

The awimming pool with its com-plement of locker, showers and services swings into a large open court. The gymnasium, similary equipped, just outward toward the athletic field.

THE CAPACITY for the present building is 1500 students. Provisions for ten more classrooms would increase the number to approximately 2000. Students will be seventh through tenth graders initially, but a high school level is planned for the future.

THE BUILDING estimate is \$13.28 per square foot. Other costs entailed in the school are \$250,000 for the site; \$378.904 for site development; \$3,183.434 for the building; \$231.478 for equipment and an estimated \$250,000 for furniture.

THERE ARE a total of 50 acres in the site, 29 of which are devoted to physical education and 21 to building and parking. The root area of the building spans floor of the building is the acres and the parking area and drives incorporates aix and three-quarter acres.

Approximately 1900 tons of structural steel was used on the project and 255 tons of preinforcing steel.

THE JOB OF the planners is almost done. It's nearly time for the teachers to begin instruction, students to begin studying.
