## City Makes New Road Maintenance Deals with Troy

City commissioners Monday night authorized Birmingham to enter into revised agreements with the city of Troy covering the maintenance of Derby and Adams roads. The maintenance agreement completed with Troy, calls for Birmingham to maintain Adams from

its Troy will pay the city \$350 annually for the service. A second agreement gives Birmingham the responsibility for maintaining Derby from Adams road east to the viaduct, with Birmingham excluded from responsibility for replacement or repair of the viaduct itself. Troy will pay \$250 annually for the work. The new agreements were made because changes in previous arrangements were requested by both Troy and Birmingham.

### Restrick is Named To Convention Post

William C. Restrick, Jr., Detroit and Birmingham lumber and building materials dealer, has been appointed chairman for the materials handling program of National Retail Lumber Dealers association's 6th annual Building Products Exposition to be held in Cleveland, November 14-17, 1959.

He is closely associated with civic and community affairs as a Rotarian and member of the Episcopal church. In his leisure time, he is a golf and jazz music enthusiast.
