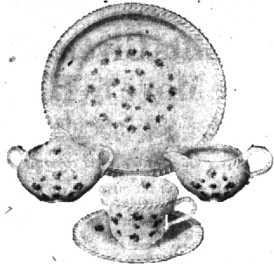

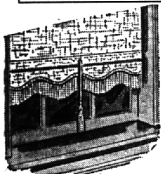

State Commission Approves Bonds For Paving, Sewers

SOUTHFIELD—Bonds totaling \$495,000 for paving, water and sewerage were approved last week by the Michigan Municipal Finance commission.

The sewers have already been installed on Rutland for \$23,000. About 30 per cent of the \$276,000 worth of water lines in areas throughout the city have been installed.

Paving of about three miles of streets will cost \$195,000. Blacktop will be laid this fall. Concrete paving is about half completed. The bonds, which will go on sale Aug. 24 will be paid for by bonding property owners in special assessment districts.

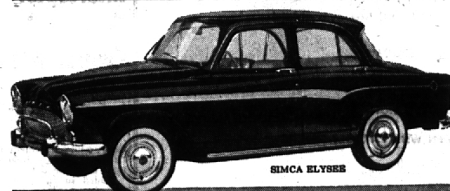
