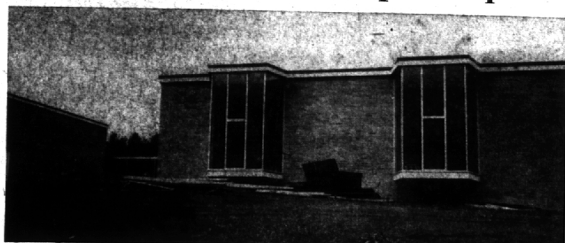
The buildings were designed by Minoru Yamasaki, well-known local architect, and consist of a social hall and three church school buildings with administrative offices.

THE STRUCTURES are grouped around an open courtyard in a campus plan and space has been left on the four-acre plot for a church building to be added at some future date.

"Work on the new buildings is progressing very satisfactorily. Although the landscaping will not be completed immediately, the buildings will be ready for our Sept. 13 opening," Peter Loomis, building chairman reported.

The furnishing committee under the direction of Mrs. Brooks Marshall has also been active during the summer.

"ONE INTERESTING development," Mrs. Marshall said, "is the use of foam rubber mats, covered with bright colored sail cloth, to be used in the younger children's classrooms. This was an inexpensive, yet practical and rather delightful solution to one aspect of the furnishing a new church plant."
