## Southfield News Briefs

### Council Asks That New Post Office Serve Entire City

SOUTHFIELD — The city of Southfield last week authorized a special letter asking Postmaster General Arthur A. Summerfield and Michigan congressmen to include the southern city boundary in the city's new post office.

The 25-acre city now served by five separate post offices will get its own post office in September. All the city except the north side of 8 Mile and Northland shopping center is to be served by the new district.

The 8 Mile district is scheduled to retain Detroit mailing addresses. Councilmen want this change. The new building located on Telegraph north of 10 Mile will open sometime between Sept. 1 and Sept. 15. No postmaster appointment has been announced.

### 7 In Oakland County Afflicted With Polio

SOUTHFIELD — A 24-year-old Southfield man is the latest of seven Oakland county persons afflicted with polio this year.

Other South Oakland cases reported to the health department are a Lathrup boy, 12, and a Berkley boy, 11. Both cases are non-paralytic. Each youngster has had the full series of Salk vaccinations.

There were two polio cases in Oakland county at this time last year, the health department said.

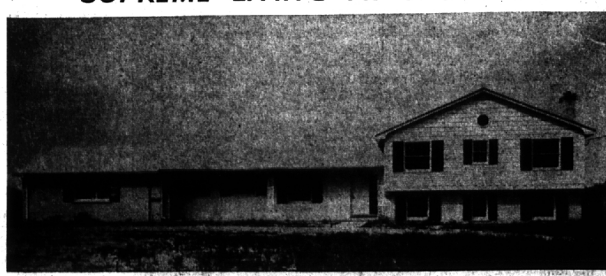
