12 Town Drain Costs Increase \$2.3 Million

OAKLAND COUNTY—The cost of the 12 Town Drain went up last week to a new total of \$48.5 million. The original estimate in 1962 was \$13 million.

Oakland County Drain Commissioner Daniel Barry has indicated that costs of the project have risen about two to three million since the last formal cost estimate in September, 1967.

THE NEW ESTIMATES are not complete, Barry said, but added that an increase in cost is expected to be almost entirely absorbed by an increase in the share to be paid by the state highway department.

The 12 Town Drain is intended to relieve flooding in South Oakland county. The highway department will be expected to pay more because of drainage for the new state highways, principally the Chrysler expressway.
