At halfback during the recent years he has thrown 12 touch down passes and completed 19 of 41 tries. Charley Connerly, Don Heinrich and George Shaw are experienced signal-callers trying for the job. Grosscup is the lone rookie.

Carl Karilivaz, defensive back for the Giants who lives in Royal Oak, is refusing to play because of salary differences. Karilivaz came to the Giants from the Lions in exchange for a draft choice (Bob Grottkau).

JIM STEFFEN, 195 pound rookie defensive back from UCLA, is earning the reputation of "big hatchet", the original hatchet being fiery Jimmy David. "little hatchet" David weighs 180 lbs. but both back hard and are aggressive. Jimmy Brown, the great Cleveland Brown bulldozing full-back was rocked hard a few times by "big hatchet" last week. Brown was held to only 36 yards in nine carries.

Are the Baltimore Colts relying mainly on the health of quarter-back Johnny Unitas for the championship? Earlier in the season the Colts' death ax, George Shaw to the New York Giants for a future draft choice and a player we've named at a later date.

Ray Brown, a Colt defensive back who intercepted eight enemy aerials, jumped into the number two spot at quarterback. If Unitas is injured can inexperienced Brown fill in with championship form? It is believed the Giants will complete the deal by sending one of the five quarterbacks to the Colts. Maybe rookie finger Lee Grosscup.
