**Officials Hush
Finance Threat
To Drain Plans**

by stamping "no publicity" order on discussions of a legal opinion that pits Oakland county's multi-million dollar drain project on a not-so-sound foundation.

Eugene Krasticky, assistant attorney-general and legal advisor to the state municipal finance commission, has held that Oakland county's pledge to guarantee bonds sold for drains is unconstitutional. It might force the county to violate the 15-mill limit on property taxes, he said.

The opinion was delivered in reference to the long-disputed Eight Mile drain.

CLAUDE H. STEVENS, bond counsel for the Oakland projects, withheld comment until he had more time to study Krasticky's opinion.

Attorney General Paul L. Adams and Stevens made the "no comment" agreement so as not to bring unfavorable publicity to the bonding matter.

They will meet privately to review the opinion before giving views to the municipal finance commission.
