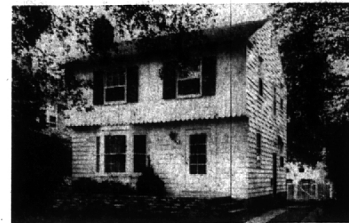
## Temporary Fire Hall Okayed by Southfield

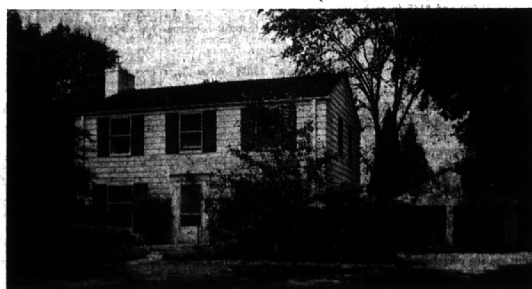
