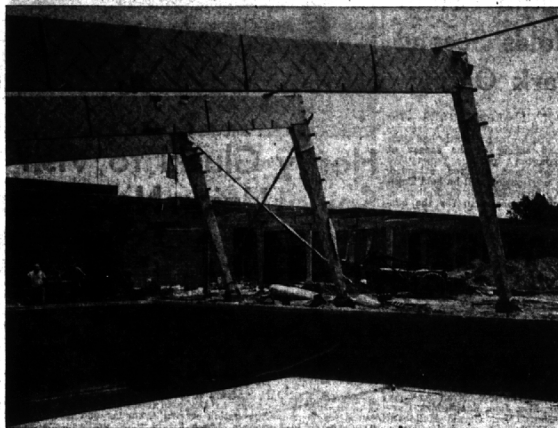
Erwins Attend Centennial In New York

New Town and Country Club

SOUTHFIELD — New facilities for the Town and Country club, now quartered in Detroit, are being constructed at 13 Mile and Southfield roads. Included in the plans are tennis courts, indoor and outdoor heated pools, a children's pool, a dining room to accommodate 600 persons, a lounge area and putting greens. The project will cost approximately \$1 million, according to Nathan Golden, head of the building committee. The 47,000-square-foot building, designed by Ferndale Architect Henry Abrams, is scheduled for completion in late November.

City Administrator Requests Removal of Makeshift Curbs

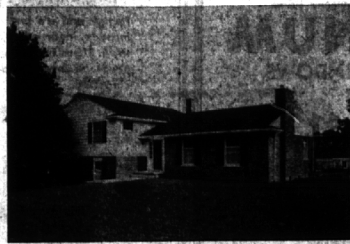
