Dave has previously played catcher, first base and all the outfield positions. Birmingham's record after the Milford game stands 10-6.

Seek State Fair Photos, Material From Early Years

Do you have any old Michigan state fair premium books, official programs or photographs that you would donate or lend for an exhibition in this year's state fair? It's the 110th annual event coming up, Sept. 4 through 18, and a good time to see how the state fair has developed over the years, according to Donald L. Swanson, general manager.

Besides, Swanson says, the state fair should have a more complete archive. As far as the state fair is concerned, "old premium books, programs and photographs would be any previous to 1950. Exceptions would be the premium books for 1942 and 1945.

World War II, when the U. S. Army occupied the fairgrounds in Detroit, and the frequent shifting of locations of the early state fairs, have hindered the collection and keeping of old records since 1849 when the State Fair became the first in the country.

Announces Art Exhibit
Michigan artists who have won an award at a regional or gallery exhibition during the past year are invited to participate in the annual art exhibition of the Michigan state fair, Sept. 4 through 18.

Artists must enter and ship paintings on or before Aug. 27, according to Donald L. Swanson, state fair general manager. One entry will be allowed from each eligible artist.

Prizes of \$150, \$125, \$100 and \$75 will be awarded in each of the oil painting and watercolor divisions. As in the past, the jury will be composed of experts in the art.

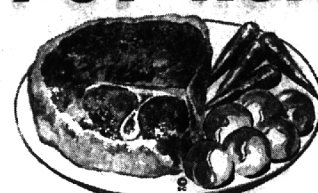
