Swim Club Asks To Build Pool in Poppleton Park
 A request for permission to construct a swimming pool at Poppleton park was made to the Birmingham city commission Monday night by Forest Hills Swim Club, Inc.
 Representing the newly-organized private club, President Leslie Fleming, 1007 Moberg, proposed an agreement whereby the city would lease a two-acre pool site from the city and operate the pool for a 20-year period. At the end of that time the city would own the pool and could operate it as a public facility. Or, if it chose, the city could lease the land, pool and buildings back to the club. A similar agreement is being negotiated by a private pool group with the City of Pleasant Ridge.
 City commissioners asked Attorney James Howlett to ready an opinion by next Monday on the legality of such an agreement.
 COMMISSIONER Lance Minor told Fleming that if the park land was dedicated to the city for public use only, he could see no way for Birmingham to lease part of the park to the club, if deep restrictions on the use would be better if the city could sell part of the park to the club, if the city agreed, he thought the club would increase the number of memberships somewhat and build a \$120,000 to \$150,000 Olympic-size pool.
 As originally proposed, the club, which now has 100 charter member families, would limit membership to 350 families. It planned to build a \$90,000 to \$105,000 Olympic pool in northeast Birmingham.
 THE CLUB'S request to purchase the city's Manor park near Shephard and the Grand Trunk RR was recently refused because of deep restrictions on the land.
 Forest Hills members met last night for a report on the pool site and a vote on a membership increase.
 Fleming stressed the time element in negotiations, saying the group hoped to have a pool in operation next summer.
 Commissioners speculated that Springdale park might be another possible pool site.
 Minor said, "Nothing would please me more than to see the city put in municipal pools. We can go into the parking and skating business. Why not into the swimming business?"
