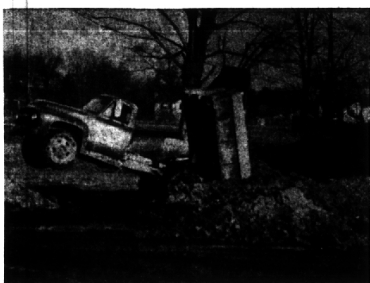

Top Newsmen to Analyze Mid-East Trouble Spot

Edward Wakin, a seasoned foreign correspondent and New York newspaperman who has covered the trouble spots of the Middle East, will lecture at 8:20 p.m. Dec. 10 in Holy Name school auditorium, Birmingham.

He is the second speaker in Holy Name's Christian culture series. His topic will be "Palestine Refugees: Key to Peace in the Middle East."

Last year, after receiving one of journalism's most important honors, the George Polk Award, Wakin arrived in Lebanon only three days before the revolution broke out and the American military forces landed.

OF LEBANESE ancestry, his command of languages and particularly the colloquial Arabic, gives him the insight to obtain accurate rate picture of the Middle-East and allows him to come up with what most people, places and trends which help clarify the story behind the headlines.

Presented on leave from the New York World-Telegram, his syndicated columns will appear in newspapers across the country.

Third speaker in the lecture series will be Eddie Dowling, Broadway's foremost actor, producer and playwright, whose topic will be "From Shakespeare to Saroyan" on Feb. 11.
