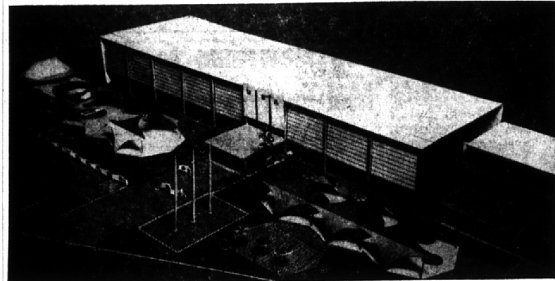


**At Grinnell College They'll Ask P. T. Kuhl**

**U.S.A. Pavilion in Yugoslavia**

This is a model of the United States' permanent display pavilion in Zagreb, Yugoslavia, that was designed and built for the 50th international trade fair held in October. Two Birmingham area residents were responsible for the design and construction of pavilion.

**B'ham Residents Help Build Zagreb Trade Fair Pavilion**

There is a permanent display pavilion now sitting in Zagreb, Yugoslavia, that was designed and constructed under the supervision of two Birmingham area residents. Ordinarily a construction project of this sort is so routine as to warrant only a paragraph or two on the inside pages, but this was not an ordinary project for the two men directly responsible.

Craig Paul, 28740 W. 13 Mile, Franklin, and Frank Moelich, 1198 Winchcomb, Birmingham, designers at Harley Earl associates in Warren, and their co-workers were given the task of building the 300 by 100-foot building.

PAUL, IN CHARGE of the overall project, and Moelich, supervisor of construction, ran into problems that do not even exist in this country. The Harley Earl associates bid on the project that was sponsored by the office of international trade

Paul and Moelich were assigned to the project and they used native labor and materials—up to a point. American government officials wanted the permanent display pavilion in Zagreb to commemorate the 50th International trade fair.

THE WHOLE project took five months to complete... and the fair lasted two weeks. When they started construction Paul and Moelich discovered that

Yugoslavia is on the metric system and all the figures in the blueprints had to be changed. Then Paul was the problem of communication.

VERY FEW person in Yugoslavia speak English and few Americans spoke Serbo-Croatian. There was also the problem of becoming adjusted to the work standards.

Yugoslavs are not accustomed to putting out the amount of work that Americans do, Moelich said. Materials are far superior in America and supplies are always at your fingertips here, Paul said.

THEIR PAINT takes about 24 hours to dry, Moelich said. The displays in the pavilion included everything from a complete outboard speedboat to a hardware store and to the Yugoslavians, it was never-over land.

There was also a complete home workshop, a camping equipment display, office equipment, a typical American kitchen with all the appliances, automobiles, three-glass exhibits and a sample of some of the American summer and winter resorts.

ALL THESE THINGS are unheard of in Yugoslavia and they seemed amazed to see one woman washing, pressing and folding numerous shirts at a complete laundry.

It took a lot of hard work to finish the project in time for the fair, but for Moelich, it was well worth it.

During the last week of the fair, his wife flew to Europe to join him and they spent their three-week vacation touring the continent.

Police are still looking for her accomplice who ran out of a local store, escaped in a cab, and then jumped out of the cab in eluding Birmingham police.

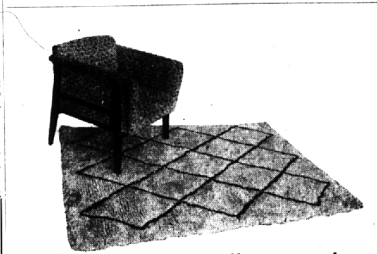
