## In Oakland County . . . Big Oakland Group to Meet At First 'Citizens' Rally

Oakland residents make up the second largest single group of Citizens for Michigan, with about 500 now enrolled in the movement organized by American Motors President George Romney.

The Oakland members will hear Romney speak next Monday at 8 p.m. at a county organizational meeting slated at Central high school auditorium, 260 W. Huron, Pontiac.

The Oakland group is second in size only to Wayne county.

Sponsoring the Oakland Citizens for Michigan meeting Monday is a committee of 30 county residents headed by former governor Murray D. Van Wageningen, 3800 Oakland, Bloomfield township. Van Wageningen is a regional chairman of the new organization, which will conduct a thorough study on state needs and taxes.

FOLLOWING Romney's talk Monday, the audience will break up by townships for chapter formation meetings on the second floor. Residents of Bloomfield township, Bloomfield Hills and Birmingham will meet in room 216 (study hall).

Southfield township residents, along with those of Lathrup and the city of Southfield, will gather in room 204.

West Bloomfield citizens are scheduled for room 206, while Troy meets in room 212.

## Lilly Asks Cities' Help On Road Job

Campaigning actively for the post as Oakland county road commissioner, Clayton G. Lilly, of Ferndale, has asked all Oakland cities to support him.

Lilly, a former Oakland county supervisor, has said that the \$7,500 road commission post should not be used "as a means to compensate veteran township supervisors for their services."

Front-runner for the road job is Hiland M. Thatcher, 67-year-old West Bloomfield township supervisor whose resignation becomes effective today.

LILLY, 40, has written a letter to the governing bodies of all Oakland cities, asking that they endorse him as a city representative on the county road commission.

All incumbent road commissioner members are former township supervisors.

The cities are entitled to representation," he said.

Lilly was replaced as Ferndale's representative on the county board of supervisors after he supported the opponent of Mayor Bruce D. Garbutt in last spring's election.
