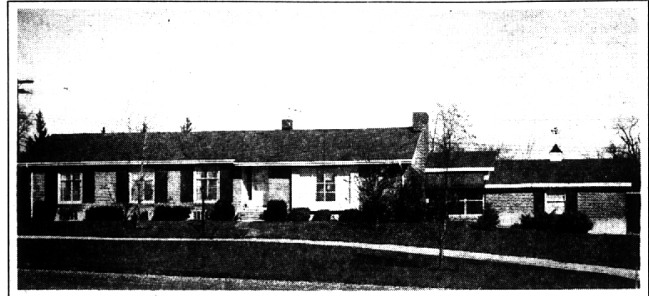


Everything's There But the Ice
