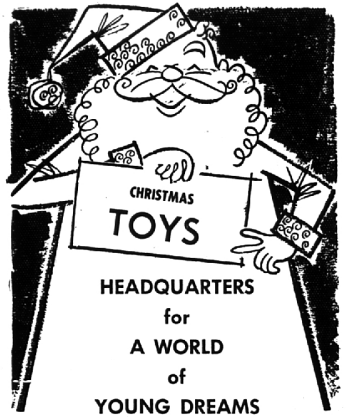
Reach Settlement On 8 Mile Drain

Circuit Judge William John Beer of Oakland county signed the decree, settling all disputes between the two cities, the county drain commission and the residents involved in the drain project.
