Bloomfield Village Man Charges Embezzlement

BLOOMFIELD VILLAGE—A Bloomfield Village man is the complainant in Detroit's largest embezzlement case in years.

Raymond F. Giffels, 929 Glenngarry, brought the complaint against Mrs. Mary McCall Averill, 58, recently of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

Giffels is president of Giffels and Rosselli, well-known Detroit architectural firm which was formerly Giffels & Vallet. Mrs. Averill left her position as the firm's head bookkeeper shortly after the retirement in 1957 of Victor E. Vallet, who was president of Giffels & Vallet.

Though there is a shortage of \$856,000 in the firm's books, Mrs. Averill is specifically charged with embezzling \$100,515. She was arraigned Tuesday before Detroit Recorder's Court.
