DUFFY JOINED Ford in 1949 as purchasing director and was named vice-president the same year. Born in Chicago in 1904, he attended West Point in 1922 and upon graduation served with the cavalry.

In 1928 he entered Columbia Law School. After a tour of duty in Hawaii he re-entered law school, obtaining his degree in 1938. He served during World War II as special assistant to the Chief of Ordnance and retired in 1946 with the rank of Colonel.

His assignment as Eagle Recognition Day program chairman includes the recruitment of some 300 key leaders, as sponsors, and the securing of a national personality as speaker at the evening dinner.

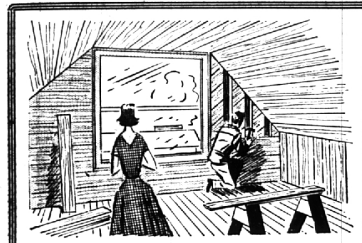
