They Opened Their Present A Little Early

One Christmas gift which could not wait until Dec. 25 has been opened and put to immediate use at Baldwin Public Library, said Miss Jeanne Lloyd, librarian.

Because of the ever-increasing business at the main desk—which loaned a total of 29,100 books last month, a second Brodac automatic charging machine has been installed, to supplement the machine bought last year.

ORIGINALLY, plans called for the purchase of the second unit when the building addition was completed.

Already, this auxiliary machine is winning favorable comments from patrons and staff. Although sympathetic and understanding in the past when peak hours have forced line-ups for book borrowing, patrons are noticeably pleased to see machine number two now go into action during these rush periods, she said.

The library staff is happy to be able to provide its many busy patrons with the added convenience of a second automatic charging machine. Miss Lloyd said both Brodac units not only speed up book borrowing but permit the immediate return of borrowed books to the library shelves.

Of course, the biggest present of all for library users and staff will be the "Post-Christmas gift" of the current building addition, due for completion before Summer, 1958, the librarian said.

Amateurs in Art Can Learn Here

CRANBROOK—Evening classes in drawing or painting for the amateur begin winter terms Tuesday, Jan. 5, and Thursday, Jan. 7, at Cranbrook Academy of Art under Jack Madison, a c a d e m y painting instructor.

Classes are held from 8 to 10 p.m. in the studio under the Art Library across from Cranbrook Academy of Art galleries, and run for ten weeks.

THE TUESDAY evening class will use still life and the human figure as models, as will the Thursday painting class members, who may choose their own media from the variety available.

Jack Madison has been a consistent prize winner since he deserted the engineering field to devote himself to painting and sculpture. He was awarded the George Gough Booth Memorial scholarship at Cranbrook in the fall of 1937 and received his M.F.A. in painting in May, 1938. He formerly attended Layton School of Art in Milwaukee, his home town, and received his B.F.A. degree at the University of Wisconsin.
