Dedicate MSUO Student Center

ROCHESTER — At ceremonies held Monday noon, Michigan state university Oakland's \$700,000 student center was dedicated. In honor of the Oakland county board of supervisors, the structure was named the Oakland student center.

Delos Hamlin, chairman of the board of supervisors, made the presentation talk and unveiled a plaque. Congressman William S. Broomfield (R-Oakland) and State Senator Harvey Lodge (R-Oakland) participated in the ceremonies following luncheon for supervisors, members of the MSUO foundation and other guests.

Clancellor D. B. Varner presided at the dedication of the center, which houses a 1,200-capacity cafeteria, private dining room and offices.

Suggest Pontiac For 2nd Major Metro Airport

An aviation consulting firm has designated Pontiac as the best site for a second major airport (in addition to Detroit Metro) to serve the expanding Detroit metropolitan area.

The firm, Landrum and Brown of Cincinnati, told officials of six area counties that Pontiac airport should be expanded to handle cross-country jet planes by 1975. Five other secondary airports should be developed in the area, the firm said.

The recommendation was included in a report to the supervisors' inter-county committee. The study of aviation needs to be requested by the committee, made up of representatives of Macomb, St. Clair, Washtenaw, Oakland, Lapeere and Monroe counties.

OAKLAND county Supervisors' Chairman Delos Hamlin said, following announcement of the aviation report that he believed the recommendation could best be carried out by giving the county authority over airports.

He suggested the possibility of the county purchasing Berz and Big Beaver airports in Troy, as well as operating the Pontiac airport.

Ask Alexander To Stay as Mayor

With over 5,000 names already signed to petitions demanding that he remain as mayor of Oak Park, R. J. Alexander is delaying a move on his intention to resign the post.

Alexander, former deputy director of the Oakland county department of public works, took over duties this month as DPW director, replacing Harold K. Schone. He announced that he would resign as mayor following the move up, to avoid any "conflicts."

Legal Aid Gets Junior League, Ford Grants

Birmingham Junior League has given a \$6,000 grant to the new Oakland county legal aid society. The amount will be matched by a Ford foundation grant which is part of a Ford gift to the Legal Aid society of the American Bar association.

The society is being organized by the Oakland bar association to offer free legal assistance to citizens unable to pay for legal services in civil cases.

The society plans to open an office in the National Bank building, Pontiac, next month. Its \$13,500 first-year budget is backed by the Junior League's Ford grant, and a \$1,500 contribution from the Oakland bar group. Attorney Carl F. Ingraham, Birmingham city commissioner, is president of the Legal Aid society.

Sholle Claims 'Get Williams' Plot Began Here

Birmingham country club was the scene of a session which plotted the campaign to "get Williams" through discrediting the state, Michigan AFL-CIO chief August Scholle charged recently at a Royal Oak Democratic party meeting.

Scholle said the campaign to "create the impression that Michigan was suffering from unfriendly government attitudes toward business started several years ago.

"The whole design was concocted over at Birmingham country club by executive officers of General Motors and others," Scholle claimed.

A twin goal of the campaign, Scholle said, "is that we would get so tired of all this that we would say okay and vote for the four per cent sales tax and protect GM."

Scholle said he learned of the meeting from an "absolute reliable source" which he could not reveal.
