## Southfield News Briefs

### Water Rates Go Up In Southfield

SOUTHFIELD — Water rates in Southfield will increase beginning Jan. 1 to coincide with Detroit's increased rate. According to City Administrator Robert J. McNutt, the increase is about 10 per cent. Most South Oakland cities have raised rates for water from Detroit through the South Oakland water authority.

### K of C to Build In Southfield
