**Armenian Americans
Keep Traditions Alive**

LATHRUP—Most interesting at this time of year is to find and talk to families who celebrate the Christmas just a little differently with traditions handed down from generation to generation and kept tenderly alive.

Scattered throughout Lathrup are a few families of Armenian extraction. Most of them celebrate the traditional Armenian Christmas, but also the Armenian Church Christmas which falls on Jan. 6.

Some have a few old world customs they keep alive because they are fun or because they add to the spirit of the season. Many of the talented cooks make unusual and different Armenian dishes involving great skills and years of practice.

A pastry requiring culinary artistry is paklava. Made of 40 sheets of phyllo dough, carefully stretched then rolled paper thin with walnuts spread somewhere in the 20th layer, it takes a full day to make. The finished product, about four inches high, flaky and crisp, melts in the mouth.

MRS. KARL COUYOUMJIAN, 19020 Sunnbrook will make paklavas to serve during the Christmas holidays. Also, she will make a rich Christmas bread. This, too, is built layer upon layer.

Karl Couyoumjan, Jr., who is 7 and his 11-year-old sister Arlene will be permitted to invite some of their young friends in for a junior open house during the holidays.

Daughters Diana and Elizabeth will entertain all Armenian sweet and hot chocolate will be served.

Guests of Dr. and Mrs. Yagobian over the holidays will be Mrs. and Mrs. Peter Adamian of Arlington, Mass., and their daughters Carol and Cynthia. Another guest from Arlington will be Mrs. Maritza Sohajian.

MRS. A. OSCAR SARJANIAN of 18700 Wiltshire has an old custom observed by her mother. "I remember my mother setting a Christmas table when I was a little girl," says Mrs. Sarjanian. "It was sort of pick-up-table with all sorts of pickles, olives, nuts, raisins, sweets and fruits. In those days the women never went visiting on Christmas, but remained at home while the men went from house to house conveying the season's greetings."

DR. AND MRS. HARRY V. REIZIAN, 18816 Middlesex helped out with the Armenian name for Santa, or Christmas Grandpa—Gaghant Baboo, and a description of a Christmas bread, paklavich, baked with a shining new dime in the center.

Whoever receives the slice of bread with the coin, is bound by custom to find good luck in the new year. According to Dr. Reizian, the Armenian Christmas treats are fruits and nuts as opposed to candy and sweets.

The Reizians expect about 35 guests Saturday evening for traditional Armenian food, songs and dances.

Instead of "Merry Christmas," the Armenian greeting is, "Christ is born and made manifest." The reply is, "Blessed is the revelation of Christ."

LATHRUP—A letter from the city of Southfield designating Evergreen road a boulevard street left Lathrup council members with a lot of questions Monday evening. The Southfield letter indicated plans for a 40-foot center median with a 20-foot pavement on each side to be widened eventually to 80 feet.

City Attorney Everett Hayes was dubious. Hayes pointed out that if a 120-foot right-of-way has not been dedicated by Lathrup property owners, Lathrup Town Hall, Inc., Evergreen road only a 66-foot street. City Clerk Frank Derby will check the dedication.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR Jerold Stone told council members that Lathrup does not maintain the half-mile of road bordering the west side of the city and, therefore does not collect gas tax refunds on it.

Copy of the letter were turned over to the Lathrup road and traffic safety committee and the property owners for recommendations.

**Cranbrook Village
'Current' Problem
Engulfs Drainage**

LATHRUP—A job for a present day Moses, that of dividing the waters, has sprung up again in Lathrup.

Ever since Cambridge village subdivision in the City of Southfield was started, Lathrup authorities have contended that drain water from Cambridge may not flow into the large 11 Mile drain built by a special assessment to Lathrup residents.

A CERTAIN AMOUNT of drainage from Cambridge flows west because of a natural watershed about 1/4 mile into Cambridge. The boundaries between Lathrup and Cambridge do not follow a natural watershed. Lathrup taxpayers and property owners complain that Cambridge village is benefitting by their tax dollars.

Councilwoman Elizabeth Mitchell and City Administrator Jerold Stone were to talk with county road and drain authorities this week in an effort to find the modern Moses who can separate the waters.
