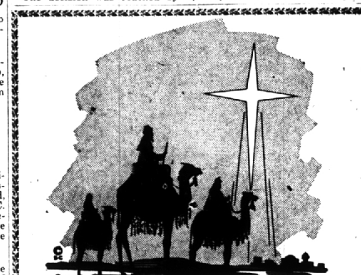
Harry B. Cunningham, 3540 Wooddale court, Bloomfield village, was named the new president and

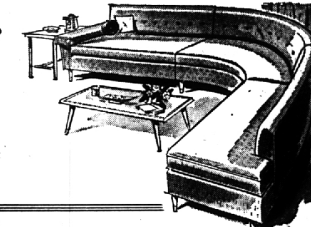

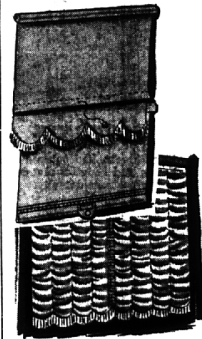

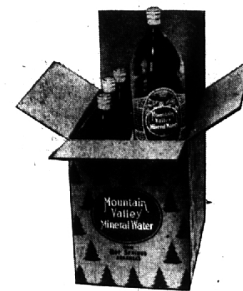
