Mr. Busch, 48, of 400 North Cranbrook, Bloomfield Township, slipped from the roof of the one-story office of the Arnold Home, Inc., 18520 W. Seven Mile. His head struck a concrete sidewalk.

Mr. Busch lived in the Birmingham area for more than 30 years. He was president of the John D. Busch & Sons Roofing Co., since 1949.

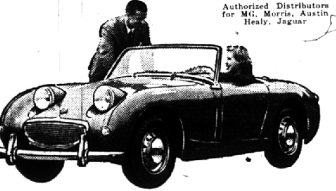

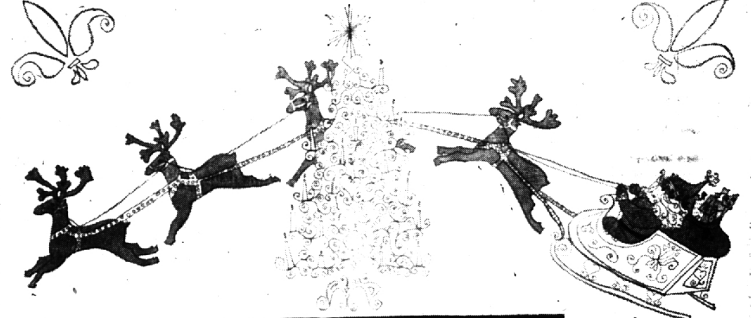
