## Cranbrook Spruced-up For Yule

CRANBROOK—Eight new exhibits add interest to a December visit to Cranbrook Institute of Science, some of them pertinent to the Christmas season.

"Dolls on Parade" are from the Institute's Indian and Eskimo collections, and are displayed in the Indian hall with a group of lithographs of Indian children by the Oklahoma illustrator Charles B. Wilson.

"Christmas Trees—Choose One" is an exhibit aimed to inform people on the merits of various types of trees used for Christmas, with labels telling what is best and why.

Also in the Indian Hall is a display of the beautiful feather ornaments of the Amazonians, with a few fine feathers from other American tribes.

Another exhibit for December is on "Indian Messages"—actually memory prompts since the tribes had no written language previous to the adoption of European systems.

The items on display are on rock wood and bark and depict a Sioux record of a war raid, a pictograph of the Ten Commandments etc.

THE MICHIGAN Mineralogical society's exhibition case at the Institute contains a special exhibit of lead ore this month, with objects made of lead or lead alloys.

"Lead," reads the label, "has been used since the dawn of history for many familiar and necessary things because of its ease of forming, resistance to corrosion, and adaptability to form alloys."

In the planetarium, "Star of Bethlehem" is the special topic of December. Public demonstrations are scheduled Sat. & Sun. at 2:30 and 3:30, Wednesdays at 4:00 p.m.
