## Chief Justice Speaks At AAUW Luncheon

"The Role of the Courts in Tomorrow's America" will be discussed by the honorable John R. Dethmers, chief justice, Supreme court of Michigan, at the monthly luncheon of the American Association of University Women, Dec. 9, in the Birmingham community house.

This is a topic in which Judge Dethmers is very interested and to which he has given much thought.

HIS MANY YEARS as a practicing attorney in Western Michigan as well as his long tenure on the bench make him unusually well qualified to bring his audience an understanding of the court system and of the decisions coming from it.

Born and reared in Northwestern Iowa, this Michigan jurist attended Hope college in Holland, Mich., and has his LL.B. and LL.D. degrees from U. of M. He also holds honorary degrees from Detroit college of law and from Hope college.

HE HAS BEEN prosecuting attorney of Ottawa county. He was chief assistant general counsel of Michigan and advisor to the Governor in 1943 and Attorney General of Michigan from 1943 to 1946.

In 1946, at the age of 42, he was appointed to the Supreme Court of Michigan, the youngest yet to have achieved this position.

He became Chief Justice in 1956 and has been active in his 13 years on the court in leading movements for improving the administration of justice and securing legislation for establishment of a court ad-

administrator for the state judicial system and a judicial conference.

HE HAS ALSO been active in the National conference of Chief Justices of the States since 1952 and as a member of its Habeas Corpus committee collaborated with a committee of the Federal Judicial Conference to work out proposed legislation to eliminate clash of jurisdiction between Federal and State Courts.
