Perhaps the most exciting presentations evolve around the morning of February 15 when vice-president Richard M. Nixon will speak on world affairs at Ford Auditorium. Mr. Nixon's appearance will mark the Seven College Committee's annual fund-raising effort, an event usually held in the fall.

THE PROCEEDS go in part to provide scholarships for Michigan girls at the individual schools. It is the fourth in a series of similar lectures which have brought outstanding personalities to the Detroit scene. Edward H. Murray and Werner von Braun have been presented in the past.

Brucker, Jr., chairman of the event and recently returned from a trip to the national capital, brought the surprise announcement that Mrs. Nixon will accompany her husband and has accepted an invitation to be the Committee's guest at a luncheon following the lecture.
