Troy News Briefs

Troy to Halt Landing Strip Near Hillmore

TROY — Troy city commissioners are taking steps to prohibit a new airplane landing strip in a residential area just east of Rochester, south of 19 Mile road. Seventy-five residents of Hillmore subdivision signed petitions protesting a landing field on a farm owned by Melvin Roy Moore.

CITY ATTORNEY Stanley E. Burke said he thought the Troy zoning ordinance may prove the landing area to be a hazard. Neighbors feel the field is too close to homes and the Troy Union elementary school.

Citizens Meet Candidates

Troy Independent Voters' council will initiate its official 1960 political campaign, aimed at electing qualified responsible persons to city offices, by holding a "Meet The Candidates" night at 8 p.m., Dec. 8, at Troy high school.

This year's council efforts, a spokesman said, will be a continuation of those put forth last year—which resulted in the election of a new Mayor and two new commission members, namely Mayor Robert Huber and Commissioners Vincent McAvoy and Wally Hodson.

At the meeting, John Czarnowski and Robert Buzzert, the two candidates unanimously selected by the Citizens' Steering committee to run for commission seats in the February primary election, will introduce themselves to the public and present a brief discussion of their platform, as well as their views on vital city needs. All interested residents of Troy have been invited to attend.

Troy to Dedicate New Post Office

TROY — The United States flag will be run up over the Troy post office Saturday at dedication ceremonies for the year-old post office.

Congressman William S. Broomfield will raise the flag over the building on Liverpool, just north of 17 Mile road.

Kenneth L. Rabadoux, assistant director of the post office department's real estate division, will speak at a luncheon before the ceremonies.

Troy Audit Draws Close Attention

TROY — Troy's 1958-59 audit drew critical attention in the assessment columns, although the city's auditors, Touche, Niven, Bailey and Smart said that the figures appear to have been honestly administered.

They commented that residents who bought water lines through special assessments in 1956 and 1958 were overcharged some \$65,558.

The auditor's report made no specific accusations of any city employee, but was confined to a discussion of assessments and bookkeeping procedures.

Troy School Board Opposes Air Strip

TROY — Troy school board members instructed Supt. Rex B. Smith to inform the city commission that school officials are opposed to the possible landing strip on the Roy Moore farm near Troy Union school.

The board protested against the proposed landing strip because of possible hazards to school children and because of the noise.

Troy Officials May Take Stand On Liquor Licenses

TROY — Troy city commissioners are thinking about taking a stand on package liquor licenses.

Two area businessmen presently have letters of application before the liquor control commission. The letters on applicants from the LCC have generally been tabled by the commissioners, pending a decision on whether the city wants package liquor at all.

The effect of a city commission stand is questionable, according to a state liquor official. He said the LCC could override a city council, but he didn't know whether or not it would.

New Alley Access Sought to Parking

Plans and specifications have been ordered from the Birmingham city engineering department for paving an alley from Adams to Worth, mid-block between Haynes and Webster.

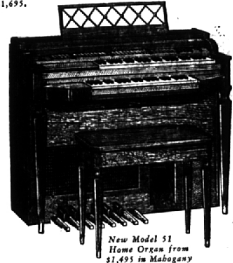
Petitioner is the W. E. Reid Co., which recently announced plans for a new \$200,000 office building on Adams. The site abuts the south side of the alley, which will provide access to a parking lot.

When the engineering report is received by the city commission, a special assessment hearing will be set.
