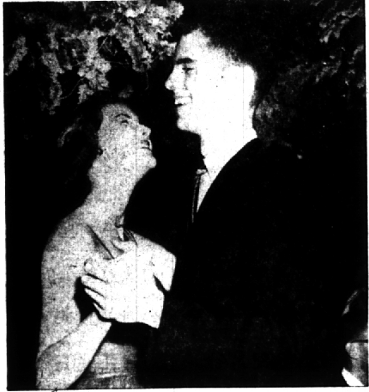

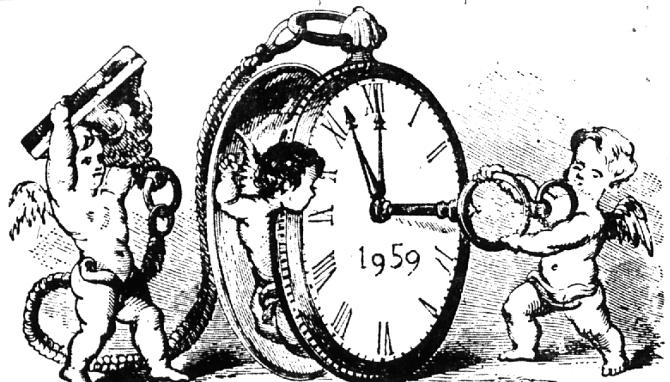
## Truth Revealed
