Easter Seal Helpers

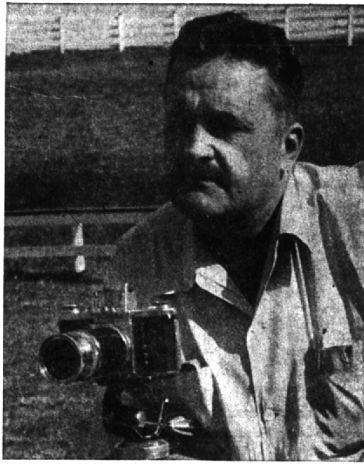

BAA Photo Exhibition Opens Here Sunday

The Bloomfield Art Association's second annual photography exhibition will open Sunday at the Association's galleries, 361 N. Woodward, Birmingham.

A BAA members reception will start the show, and the exhibit will be open to the public every Saturday and Sunday from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. for four weeks.

The exhibition will consist of two parts. The first is an exhibit of nearly 200 photographs selected from the work of local photographers.

Entitled "Fairs and Festivals," it will include photographs by Bill Crise, president of the Bloomfield Hills Camera club, J. Elwood Armstrong, Hank Webster, Karl Bailey, Marvin Hill, Bob Hughes, R. O'Rahilly, O. S. Koskinen and Paul Averill.

THE SECOND part will be a one-man show by Harvey Croze, staff photographer at Cranbrook. Nationally known for his camera work, Croze had a one-man show at the Smithsonian Institute last year. His show at the BAA will include 100 pictures never shown before. All portray the human figure as interpreted by the camera.

In addition to the show there will be two other activities during the four-week exhibition. The BAA's regular Critic's Roundtable will be open to the public Feb. 20, and three motion pictures will be featured.

CROZE WILL SHOW his "Artists at Work," which depicts leading artists in the Cranbrook area at work. The second film, "Swamp" is an experimental motion picture produced by the University of Minnesota and recently featured in a New York Times article.

The third picture, "Nature of Things," is done by Bill Nicholas. Lensed slides from top local photographers will be featured at a program to be held March 13. Assisting Mrs. McIntyre in hanging the show are Bill Crise, Bob Hughes, Nida Crise, Jean Newton, Croze and Clifford West.

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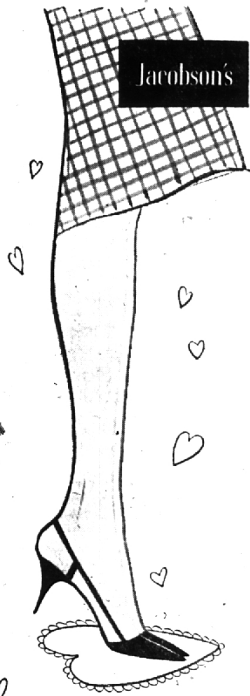
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
