## Transplant Shaw Dilemma to Film

Anyone considering himself a student of human affairs will enjoy the very well-cast and beautifully-mounted version of George Bernard Shaw's "The Doctor's Dilemma" now playing at the Krim theater.

Under the skilful direction of George Aguiñiga this play, and it remains just that, despite the transplant to celluloid, sparkles with the pungent, unswervingly direct, penetrating wit that makes of every Shaw play a game of mental table-tennis—a striking social satire.

"The Doctor's Dilemma" de-thronos the medical profession of the turn of the century—its pomposity, its backslapping, and its unholo pretense to medical knowledge that it does not possess.

BUT MEDICINE by no means must bear the brunt of Shaw's raptier criticism alone. Many other arenas of human folly come in for their fair share of Shavian probing—morality, death, art and the meaning of beauty are just a few. Women who always made Shaw remain entirely in the realm of the inevitable enigma which partly resolves itself in a most O'Henry-like manner.
