Actual practice though, most Republican votes will go for the Republican candidates, and Democrats will vote for Democrats. This condition, however, should not bear unwarranted criticism; for, after all, how can candidates for a political office be elected without the active support of members of their own political parties?

A recent issue of the Congressional Record lists 2422 farming firms or individual farmers who received \$10,000 or more in 1957 for not planting crops on land put into the government's acreage reserve program. Top single payment was \$332,000. If Uncle Sam were impartially honest with all producers, he also should pay small and large companies comparable payments for not being able to use all their productive equipment and labor. The chief reason Uncle Sam doesn't is because industry doesn't have the votes that farmers possess.

Robert F. Kennedy, Chief Counsel of the Senate Rackets Committee, writes in a magazine: "The worst elements of the American labor movement are creating an unholy alliance that could dominate the United States within three to five years. It is an alliance of transportation unions that could stop trucks from East to West, tie up ships on all three coasts and embargo all goods on trains and planes." B'ham Schools Add 2 New Vote Precincts

Many Birmingham area residents will find it easier and more convenient to vote in school elections thanks to an increase in voting precincts approved by the Birmingham board of education Tuesday night.

The board approved increasing the voting precincts from 11 to 12 and eliminated voting at Birmingham high school and Barnum junior high school.

The voting districts will be as follows:
PRECINCT 1, ADAMS SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Big Beaver, on the east by Adams, and the G.T.W.R.R. on the south by Hazel (both sides) west of Adams and Villa roads (both sides) east of Adams, and on the west by Woodward.

PRECINCT 2, QUARTON SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by the district limits, on the east by N. Woodward, Redding road and the River Rouge, on the south by W. Maple, and on the west by Covington road.

PRECINCT 3, BALDWIN SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Redding road, on the east by Woodward, on the south by Lincoln, and on the west by the River Rouge.

PRECINCT 4, PIERCE SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Lincoln, on the east by Woodward, on the south by Fourteen Mile and on the west by the River Rouge.

PRECINCT 5, FRANKLIN VILLAGE SCHOOL: The area included in the former Franklin school district, being that part of the Birmingham school district bounded on the north by Fourteen Mile, on the east by the eastern boundary of the village of Bingham Farms, on the south by the district limits, and on the west by Inkster road.

PRECINCT 6, BIEBEL VILLAGE SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Quanton road, on the east by Covington road and south Cranbrook road, on the south by Fourteen Mile, and on the west by the district limits.

PRECINCT 7, WALNUT LAKE SCHOOL: The area included in the former Walnut Lake school district, being that part of the Birmingham school district bounded on the north by the district limits, on the east by the district limits, on the south by Fourteen Mile, and on the west by Middlebelt road.

PRECINCT 8, MIDDLE AVE SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by W. Maple, on the east by the River Rouge, on the south by E. Maple, and on the west by S. Cranbrook road.

PRECINCT 9, TORRY SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Bowers street (both sides) west of Adams road, Hazel street (both sides) east of Adams road, Maple (east of the G.T.W.R.R.) on the east by the district limits, on the south by Fourteen Mile, and on the west by Woodward.

PRECINCT 10, PEMBERKE SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Big Beaver, on the east by the district limits, on the south by E. Maple, and on the west by the G.T.W.R.R. and N. Adams.

PRECINCT 11, BEVERLY SCHOOL: The area bounded on the north by Fourteen Mile, on the east by Pierce, Beverly (both sides) west of Pierce and Southfield, on the south by the district limits, and on the west by the east-

Mathews Pays Fine, Adds His 2 Cents Worth

Fenton Mathews, 6000 N. Adams, Troy, had the last word on his \$1 overtime parking ticket Monday, but it cost him \$22.

Ticketed Sept. 8 for overtime parking, leaving keys in the ignition and improper parking, he demanded jury trials. A jury of six women found him guilty Feb. 4 of the overtime parking violation, and Municipal Judge John C. Emery ordered him to pay a \$6 fine and \$27 court costs.

MONDAY City Clerk Irene Hanley received a cashier's check for \$13. On the back of it Mathews had typewritten this message: "Parking meter payment to Public Servants, Birmingham, Mich. 1959, for follow up achievement. Hate, vengeance, brutality, hypocrisy, cowardice used to obtain this money for self destruction, village business, economy and morality. 'May this pack of American Christians gain wisdom and protect — not destroy — American ideals.'"

The city has not decided yet whether it will take Mathews to court on the other tickets.
