NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF BLOOMFIELD HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2, COUNTY OF OAKLAND, MICHIGAN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, on Thursday, March 5, 1959, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, for the purpose of voting on the following propositions:

- I. Bonding Proposition
Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Seven Hundred Ninety Thousand (\$790,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting and furnishing an addition to the junior high school building and a new one-unit elementary school building on the Quarton Road site?
- II. Operating Millage Increase Proposition
Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, for all purposes except taxes levied for the payment of obligations incurred prior to December 8, 1952, be increased as provided in Section 21, Article X of the Constitution of Michigan, by four and six-tenths (4.6) mills (\$4.60 on each \$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the School District for a period of three (3) years, the years 1959 to 1961, both inclusive, and by three and six-tenths (3.6) mills (\$3.60 on each \$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the School District for a period of three (3) years, the years 1962 to 1964, both inclusive, for the purpose of providing additional funds to meet operating expenses of the School District?

- Each person voting on the above bonding proposition (Proposition I) must be—
- (a) A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;
 - (b) A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election;
 - (c) The owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the husband or wife of such owner;
 - (d) A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.
- Each person voting on the above millage increase proposition (Proposition II) must be—
- (a) A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;
 - (b) A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election;
 - (c) A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the appropriate city or township clerks of the city or township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with the city or township clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the clerk's office is open for registration.
