Uncle Sam Helped Him Through Divinity School

Thanks to the GI Bill the Congregational church of Birmingham got a permanent pastor Sunday.

The Rev. Raymond A. Fenner financed his way through two years of college and Yale Divinity school under the bill—and through the help of his wife, Jean, who worked as a secretary at a child psychiatric clinic while he was a student.

They lived in a veteran's housing project during his three years at Yale and had to scrimp and save like many other veterans who went to school following the war.

"We had an awful lot of fun, though," Rev. Fenner said, and his wife agreed.

The Fenners and their three children, Steven, T. David, 5, and Cheryl, 3, arrived in Birmingham last week from Fremont, Calif., where Rev. Fenner was pastor of the Freeman Congregational church for three years.

They ARE presently living in the church's parsonage, 1290 Pierce, Birmingham.

Rev. Fenner took over the duties vacated by interim pastor Dr. Alfred D. Grey.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, he ministered at the Manhasset, N. Y., for three years, and then went to Columbus.

HE POINTED out that the ministry was like other jobs in many aspects.

"You have to go to school a little longer than most people, but after you get out it is much the same," he said.

He said a young minister just out of school was usually given a job at a small parish or as an associate minister until he had a chance to "learn the ropes," much the same as an apprentice in other jobs has to do.

THE MAJOR difference he noted between the ministry and other jobs was the long hours that most ministers are required to put in.

"The ministry is a double-time job, but I'm not complaining," he said.

He stressed that the important thing for a minister to do is to budget his time so he can do his best at everything he undertakes.

He also had a word of advice for young men who may be thinking of joining the ministry.

"They should keep a stiff upper lip," he said.
