

Crowd Treats Actress As Long-Lost Relative

Everyone remembers Mama. That's why the crowd surrounding actress Peggy Wood in a Detroit department store treated her like a long-lost relative.

She was promoting "Peggy Wood housewives" in a smart, red outfit, stylish gray hair, and perfect diction.

BUT THE CROWD saw only Mama Hansen meeting friends in her simple dress, blonde braids, and Norwegian accent.

"You're just like one of the family," people repeated excitedly. Despite her success as a versatile actress, novelist, playwright, journalist, and lecturer, Miss Wood is unexpectably "Mama" of the "Remember Mama" television series.

Though the series ended three years ago, re-runs of some of the filmed episodes keep the identity of Miss Wood as "Mama" in the mind of the public.

And so does her new side career as housewife promoter.

"THE HOUSEWIFE" business began as a promotion for the "Remember Mama" show. Miss Wood explained. After the series ended, the manufacturers asked to use my name for the dresses.

"I became so interested that I bought some of them myself. Now I hardly ever wear anything else at my country home in Connecticut."

While co-starring with Imogene Coca in a tour of "The Girls in the Sun" now at the Shubert, Miss Wood squeezes in time to appear at stores carrying her housewife.

Everywhere she goes, people come to meet her "adopted Mama." Often they bring gifts as well as greetings.

"IT'S NOTHING MUCH," said one Detroit woman presenting a small, wooden, wall decoration with "Greetings from Norway" in bright

Norwegian letters. "But it's been in the family for years, and I've been wanting to give you something for a long time."

With warm thanks, the Brooklyn-born actress spoke a few words of Norwegian and told how the "Mama" role opened an area of culture to her.

Though Miss Wood feels it isn't good for an actor to be too strongly identified with one role, she understands the public's attachment to "Mama."

"MAMA HANSEN is typical of all wonderful mothers," she once explained.

"After I began playing the part, I realized I was acting the remembrance of my own mother."
