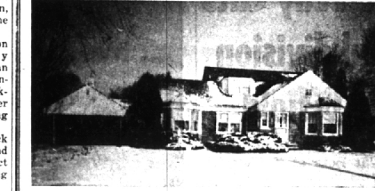
Square Dance Club Plans Dinner-Dance

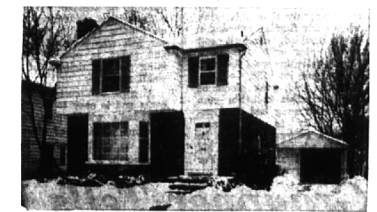

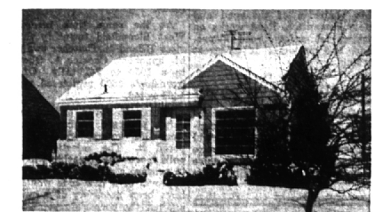
