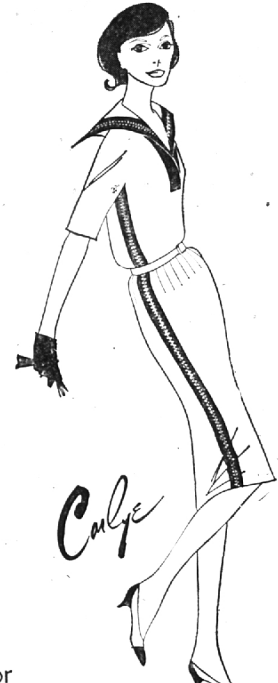
Brook Receives BA Degree
