Freezing, Thawing Helps Fertilize

It is just as true as day following night, Spring is around the corner and this is the time for you to order your fertilizer. Around the fifteenth of March is a good time to have your early application of fertilizer.

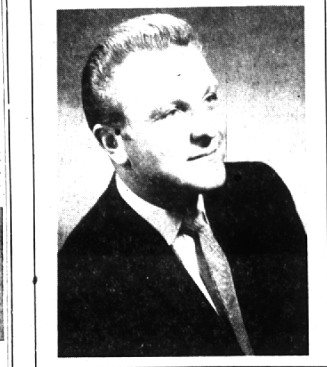
A very light covering of snow on the ground will help you avoid missing an area with the spreader. When the ground freezes and thaws, it develops crevices which allow the fertilizer to give a deep application to the roots of grass. Any day that the temperature is 40 degrees, those grass roots are growing.

Brother Ball (my colleague who pays to have his column printed and has just "beat my time" and had his trip to South America ahead of me) and I agree that the best way to build a good lawn is to apply lots of fertilizer. Then you can cut down considerably on your seed bill.

HERBS should be incorporated someplace in everybody's garden, and the finest booklet I have ever seen has been published by the Brooklyn botanical gardens, Brooklyn, New York. Within this 172-page book with at least two pictures on a page, you can see a picture of a specimen, its horticultural use, culture and how to harvest it.
