

Commission OKs Fertilizer Bid

A \$1,357 low bid by McClelland-Laird Co., 852 S. Woodward, for 14 tons of Agricor fertilizer was accepted by the city commission Monday night.

This is the first year the city has taken bids on fertilizer. Charles W. Gale, superintendent of the department of forestry and parks, said the city accepted bids this year in an effort to receive a more favorable price by buying in quantity.

In the past fertilizer was purchased in small lots as it was needed.

Prices were also quoted for six tons of Milorganite, a special type of fertilizer, but Gale recommended that portion of the bid not be accepted. He said he believed a substitute material could be obtained at a lower cost.

Raise License Fees

A recommendation by Andrew P. Butt, building inspector, to increase the present electrical contractors' and journeyman license fees from \$45 to \$50 was unanimously approved by city commissioners Monday.

The increases were previously approved and adopted by the City Council. The Board of the Electrical Board.

Butt said the basic reason for the increase is to cover the cost of the city's involvement in checking registrations and licenses during the year with the electrical contractors.

"I am sure that most neighboring communities had either raised their fees or were in the process of doing so," he said.
