He Writes Books In His Spare Time

He writes when he has time—on airplanes, in the office, in hotel rooms or at home.

Which is probably why the Rev. Dr. Reuel L. Howe, director of the Cranbrook Institute for Advanced Pastoral Studies is the successful author of two major religious books.

His latest book, "The Creative Years," is reported to be selling well, and his first book, "Man's need and God's Action" has sold over 40,000 copies.

Dr. Howe pointed out that the average religious book sells between 3 and 10 thousand copies.

His writing career began in high school when he became interested in journalism. He was editor of the high school paper and worked on the paper at Whitman college, Walla Walla, Wash.

He decided to enter the ministry while attending Whitman and after receiving his BA degree there he enrolled in the Philadelphia Divinity school.

"I knew I wanted to be a writer, but I was concerned about the problems of life and its resources," Dr. Howe said in explanation of his decision to become a minister and religious writer.

While attending college and divinity school, he devoted a great deal of time to studying the social sciences and now uses this background while writing.

"I TRY to bring insight into the fields of social science and theology in my books," he said, and added that his 20 years of experience as a religious teacher had given him a great deal of material for his books.

In addition to his two major works, he has contributed to several other books and is now planning to do a book on pastoral and teaching work for ministers.

He said he was particularly interested in translating the "great truths" into language the layman could understand.

DR. HOWE met his wife while attending divinity school. He served as an assistant in a nearby parish where she was a Sunday school teacher. They were married in 1932.
