

## Children to Collect For Clothing Drive

Birmingham school children are well dressed youngsters. But they haven't forgotten that some children are not so fortunate.

So, to help provide clothing for children and their families in underprivileged areas of America, primarily the Southern Appalachian Mountains, students of the Birmingham public schools will collect clothing during the week of Feb. 16-20.

The drive is part of the 17th annual Bundle Day Clothing Collection sponsored by Save the Children Federation in schools across the nation.

THIS YEAR, conditions are especially acute due to unemployment and floods. Clothing is desperately needed to clothe school children as well as entire families. Donated clothing is sent to the Southern Mountains, where it is made available through S.C. Clothing Centers, at very low prices, thus enabling a poor but proud people to maintain their self-respect.

PARENTS, NEIGHBORS and friends are urged to donate good, used summer or winter clothing for children, babies, and adults. Clothing may be brought or sent to school in bags or cartons. It will be re-packed for shipment. Low-heeled shoes and overshoes are especially requested. Also needed are arctic coats and dresses, pants, underwear, socks, shirts, sweaters, skirts, caps, blankets, sheets and baby clothes.
