AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE MAXIMUM AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE MAXIMUM WEIGHT OF VEHICLES TRAVELING ON THE STREETS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE VILLAGE OF WESTWOOD AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Village of Westwood Ordains: Section 1. Definitions.

(a) "Maximum Axle Load" means the gross weight over the axle which includes vehicles and load.

Section 2 Weight Limitations.

(a) All\_notor trivics, tractors, trailers or semi-trailers, except as hereinafter provided in paragraph (b) of this section, of more than 3500 pounds weight now operating or hereafter placed in operation upon the public streets under the jurisdiction mation relative to their width of tire, gauge, width over all, length, weight and carrying capacity, and name and address of registered owner of vehicle in letters of at least 3 inches in height. (a) Any public safety officer of the Village of Westwood, having reason to believe that the weight of a whicle and load is misseful, may require the driver to stop and submit to a weightness of the safety of the safet

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effec-tive 10 days after its publication.
