and science development, according to results of the Iowa Tests of Educational Development recently given to 460 tenth graders.

Testing director Miss Mary Lou Lake revealed that the class scored above the national average in all fields of the nine-test battery, designed to provide a comprehensive description of a high school pupil's general educational development.

Eleven Sophomores achieved the highest rank possible on the test. Miss Lake added, six more than would be expected in an average school. Of the top-ranked 11, one student earned a score achieved by only 10 of every 100,000 taking the test.

The test not only helps school counselors to determine students' strengths and weaknesses, but also aids in evaluating the educational offerings of the school system.
