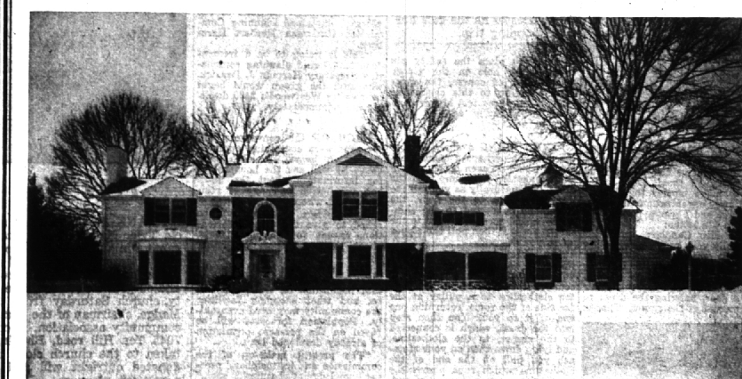
Howells Entertain At Cocktail Party
