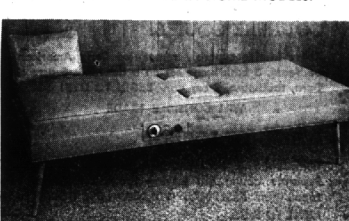

mission of plans for building projects that may violate the restrictions of the subdivisions.

3. Actual inspections of all construction during all of its stages once the building permit is issued so that the building codes will be strictly enforced.

4. The appointment of persons to the zoning and planning boards who will promote and conserve the residential character of the township.

5. Development and presentation of a comprehensive plan for the orderly growth of the township.

6. Re-evaluation of the tax assessments so that assessments will be uniformly equitable. A hold-the-line on our tax structure, considering the economic difficulties which are compelling many of our property owners to offer their properties for sale.

7. Thorough study of the various forms of government available to electors so that the inherent weaknesses of township government may be remedied.

8. Complete disclosure of all information concerning township affairs.
