

**2 Men Plead Guilty, Sentenced to Jail**

Two Detroit men pleaded guilty to a charge of larceny by trick when arraigned Monday in Birmingham municipal court before visiting Judge William T. Seavid of Royal Oak.

Judge Seavid ordered Russell York Jr., 40413 Mack, and Ossie Jackson, 406 Algonquin, to pay a \$150 fine and \$10 court costs or serve 30 days in jail. The men were charged by the fine and were sent to the Oakland county jail.

Both men were arrested Friday after they used a "quick-change" trick to take \$20 from Delbert Taylor, an attendant at Mobile gas station, Fourteen mile at Woodward.

**Burroughs Corp. Names Lathrup Man New Director**

Ray W. Macdonald, 18801 Glenwood, Lathrup Village, vice president in charge of the International Division, Burroughs Corporation, has been elected a director of the corporation. It has been announced by Lay R. Eppert, president.

Macdonald, who has been a Burroughs vice president since 1954, started his career with the company while a student at the University of Chicago. After his graduation from the school of business administration of the university in 1935, he joined Burroughs as a junior salesman.

Four years later he was transferred to the home office marketing activity in Detroit.

IN 1941 HE JOINED what then was the Burroughs Export department and two years later became assistant manager. In 1948 he was appointed manager. In 1953, he was promoted to general manager.

On March 1, 1957, he was named vice president in charge of the international division which at that time was given the responsibility for manufacturing in addition to marketing outside of the United States and Canada.

Macdonald is a native of Chicago. He is a past president of the World Trade Club of Detroit, chairman of the world affairs committee of the Greater Detroit Board of Commerce, and a member of the United States committee of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce. He has been a member of the advisory committee of the United States Department of Commerce for 10 years.

DURING THE period that he has held executive positions, Burroughs manufacturing overseas has been expanded and there has been increased market penetration in every part of the world. There are now 22 Burroughs subsidiary marketing companies. Burroughs overseas activity covers 83 countries.

Overseas production reached a new peak in 1958 with the completion of a new plant with 336,000 square feet of floor space at Cumberland, Scotland, which started the manufacture of accounting machines and other office equipment. This is in addition to two other factories in the United Kingdom.

RUMMINGER said that business was bad until he was approached by Teamster business agent Roland McMaisters who told him he would get him more business if the commission was split 50-50.

McMaisters, agent of Local 293, (Teamster president James Hoff's local) refused to answer the questions of the committee on the grounds of self-incrimination.
