Pianist's Antics Baffle Audience

Many a binocular was raised to eyes at Ford auditorium recently. People watched, perplexed, as the young Canadian pianist Glen Gould actually played the Bach F minor concerto and the Mozart C minor concerto with legs crossed at the knee and in a sitting position so close to the floor that his long angular hands were almost parallel with his shoulders as he played.

Add to this, the picture of this Ichabod Crane figure, hair disheveled, sitting slumped in a seething reverie during the piano's pauses only to rouse itself on cue and produce golden, caressing, yet precise sounds in an intimate approach to these works rarely heard.

All mannerisms, and there were many, seemed to be limited to the pianist's sitting and preparation. For the playing itself was clear, clean and surprisingly matter-of-fact. Bold power, sorely abused by so many, was held carefully in check by Gould. He used it only in the few sections of both works where it was needed to be.

IT MUST be supposed that this young pianist's sit in such an alarmingly awkward position must stem from some physical disability. Not this exhibition could not be excused. With such bizarre distractions offered to the listener, the piano sounds good if one does watch. But much better in one so young.

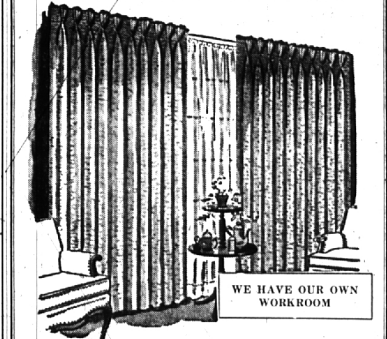

The City commission last week approved a \$2 increase in court costs where it is necessary for a warrant officer to serve a warrant. The commission acted on the matter after approving the appointment of Wesley J. Skowron as warrant officer for the city.

SKOWRON, who had been working for the city for several months, pointed out that the present \$3 court costs he received for his time and transportation in serving warrants was not adequate.

Motorists have three days to pay fines before two reminder notices.

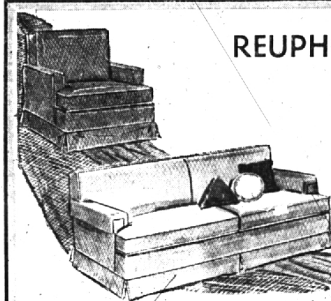
